## Last Will & Testament.

Know all men by these presents, that, I George Jacob Gerber of the City of St. Louis in the state of Missouri, being in good health and of sound mind and disposing memory, and desirous to settle my worldly affairs and dispose of property, I may die seized and possessed of, do make and publish this, my Last Will, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

I hereby constitute and appoint my wife (Franziska) sole executrix of this my last Will, directing my said executrix, Franziska Gerber to pay all my just debts and funeral expences and the legacies hereinafter given, out of my Estate, and also direct and order my oldest son, George Louis Gerber to aid and assist my said executrix in performance of her duties as such.

After the payment of my said debts and funeral expences, I give to my children  
1, George Louis Gerber, now aged 20 years  
2, Otto Hugo Gerber " 16 "

3, Philip Adolph Gerber " 14 "  
4, Frederic William Gerber " 8 "  
5, Rudolph Matthias Gerber " 5 "

One dollar each to be paid to them as soon after my decease, but in one year, as

As to the Balance of My Estate,  
and all the property, real, personal, or mixed  
of which I shall die seized and possessed  
of, I devise bequeath and dispose thereof  
in the manner following to wit:

I give and bequeath unto my beloved  
wife Francisca all my personal property  
and the income of my real estate property  
respectively the stores and dwelling houses  
thereon as long as she shall remain unmar-  
ried and my widow, to hold the same  
and improve it to the best possible ben-  
fit and use of herself and my minor chil-  
dren. Should my wife Francisca not re-  
main unmarried and my widow, but be-  
come the legal wife of another after my de-  
cease, she at that moment shall cease to be  
the executrix of this, my last will, but  
said duty and the responsibility of the  
same shall devolve upon the oldest of my  
children, then of age, and it is further here-  
by directed, that, should my wife commit such  
folly, that an immediate investigation  
and inventory be taken of the remainder  
of the estate and the same divided to  
equal parts, share and share alike, to  
my above named children.

It is my desire, and I hereby order, the

real estate remaining after my decease,  
to be improved, thereby realizing a higher  
revenue from the same, and no sale detri-  
mental to the estate shall take place, un-  
til the time, when the youngest child  
will have become of legal age, at what  
time the remaining estate shall be sold for  
division.

All the residue and remainder of  
my estate, whether real, personal or mixed  
I leave devise and bequeath, unto my  
beloved wife Francisca Gerber under  
the provision above given.
